

The Healing Patch program offers supportive services to grieving children and families who have experienced a significant death.

The following services are offered:

- In-School Services (see right)

IN-SCHOOL SERVICES

Patch Club: In-School Peer Support Groups

Healing Patch works with school districts lacking community bereavement services. HP staff and/or volunteers train school personnel (i.e. school counselor, social worker, etc.) in facilitating 6-week peer support groups. Through this "train the trainer" approach, school districts are equipped to offer Patch Club for different ages based on the needs of their students. Healing Patch staff could remain in a consultive role supporting school grief facilitators after training. Through group discussions and various activities, the following are addressed among peers:

- issues surrounding the death
- feelings
- fears & worries
- memories
- changes and rebuilding

Grief Education in the Classroom

Healing Patch staff and/or volunteers present grief/loss & death/dying information as part of middle/high school health class curriculum. Students will gain an understanding of the following:

- the normal feelings & responses often associated with the grief process
- how to support a peer who is grieving
- how to seek out supportive services through their school & community

Educational In-Services

Healing Patch staff and/or volunteers present educational workshops/in-services to school personnel, Parent-Teacher Organization members, or groups of parents/ caregivers on various grief-related topics. The goal is to provide the following:

- an awareness of the needs of grieving children
- knowledge of the needs of grieving children at different developmental stages
- how to support a grieving child
- information regarding available community resources for grieving children
- an understanding of Children's Grief Awareness Day
